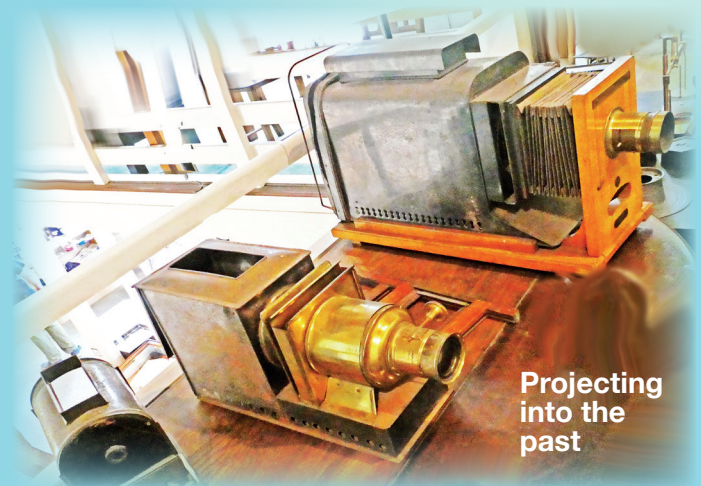

The ceremonial spade dug out the first sod of earth to start the building of the Leominster to Kington Railway in 1854.



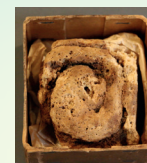
